Level I

- Level I Residential group supportive care for children between the ages of 10 and through 18 (at time of admittance). Supervised by qualified, trained Teaching Parent couples.
- Residential transitional living program for children 16+ who have demonstrated responsible behaviors and can move toward living on their own.
- Professional evaluations and counseling for residents and families.
- Medical and other health services provided by local physicians.
- Supervised recreational and leisure-time activities including a variety of physical and social activities.
- Education provided in small public school setting with tutoring services.
- Family Atmosphere within a structured therapeutic environment. Certified husband and wife team serves as “Teaching Parents” living with the residents on a 24 hour / 5 day week basis.
- Maximum of ten residents per cottage. Two per bedroom.
- Former show horse ranch. Horses are available and used for Equine Assisted Therapy.
- Many recreational activities available on-grounds, including fishing, weight and recreation rooms, softball field, lighted outdoor basketball, tennis and volleyball courts, gymnasium, indoor year round swimming pool, and more.
- Activities Coordinator on staff.
- Assessment and evaluation as required. Individual, group and specialized counseling as needed.
- Character development through a structured environment nurtured by a healthy balance of discipline, recreation, education, social, and work experiences.
- Psychological testing and evaluation provided on site by a consistent, contracted licensed psychologist.
- Consistent, contracted Registered Nurse on staff.
- Utilize local psychiatric facilities and consideration of re-admission after treatment.
- Juvenile Sexual Offender Treatment as a step down to previous treatment and evaluated as a low risk.
