### Level II

The program provides residential treatment services and academic and therapeutic support to male and female youth, ages 12 to 21, who have co-existing mental/behavioral health and intellectual or developmental disability diagnoses. The program is designed to provide care, supervision, support, treatment and skills training, to youth with multiple disabilities in a community-based setting. In addition to intellectual and/or developmental issues, youth also present a range of emotional issues and challenging behaviors that prevent them from living within their home environment. Many have been traumatized by physical and sexual abuse, neglect, multiple living situations and family addiction issues while others have experienced truancy, family problems, substance abuse and juvenile justice issues. The ultimate goal of the program is to help you achieve permanency through family reunification, adoption, or independence/transition to adulthood. The program is based on a trauma informed, positive behavior support treatment model with a strong emphasis on youth involvement with community-based resources and activities including enrollment in local community schools. Youth are involved in family-style activities like preparing meals, doing chores and going on outings as well as attending public school in a community setting. The program is situated on 10 acres in a newly developed residential community in Berkeley County, WV and currently serves a total of 15 youth. Youth live in 3 gender-specific residential houses that each contain five bedrooms, four bathrooms, an open concept kitchen/dining/living area, a laundry room, and recreation and game rooms. The staffing ratio is a minimum of two staff per five residents. Treatment services occur on a daily basis and are provided by a multidisciplinary treatment team under the direction of the agency's Psychiatrist. All direct care staff have a minimum of a bachelor's degree and all of BCC's therapists and addictions counselors are licensed professionals at the master's degree level and are highly trained in evidenced based treatment models and in family therapy so they are able to work closely with families whenever appropriate. Services are trauma-informed, youth guided, family focused and culturally competent and designed to help youth overcome emotional, psychological, educational, substance use and behavioral issues to help them heal from trauma and gain the skills, self-esteem and motivation to move towards social and academic success and function as responsible community members.
